#### WS 001 010: Women & Men in Society (4 credits) (SS) CRN 21026

Cancelled

The course introduces students to key concepts, theoretical frameworks, and interdisciplinary research in the field of Women's and Gender Studies. Examines how gender interacts with race, age, class, sexuality, etc., to shape human consciousness and determine the social organization of human society. The course may include topics such as: gender and work; sexuality and reproduction; women's health; media constructions of gender and race; gender, law and public policy.

#### WS 129 010: History of Fashion and Style (4 credits) (HU) CRN 20131

Dress and culture in the Western Hemisphere from prehistory to today. The evolution of silhouette, garment forms and technology. The relationship of fashion to politics, art and behavior. Cultural and environmental influences on human adornment.

#### WS 191 010: Special Topics: Feminism/Social Activism (3 credits) (HU) CRN 20988

A popular slogan for modern women's rights advocates—found anywhere from bumper stickers to refrigerator magnets—is that “well behaved women seldom make history.” The underlying concept here is that in order to make change, we must act out. Indeed, from the hunger strikes of 19<sup>th</sup> century suffragists to “Take Back the Night” and *The Vagina Monologues* on college campuses worldwide, a core component of the call for justice and equality is social and political activism. In this class we'll examine the varied expressions of historical and contemporary women's activism at the community, national, and transnational levels. Through readings, participating in activism, and class discussions we'll consider activist strategies and what constitutes activism, building alliances, the power of activism for social and political transformation, and making transitions from theory to activism.
